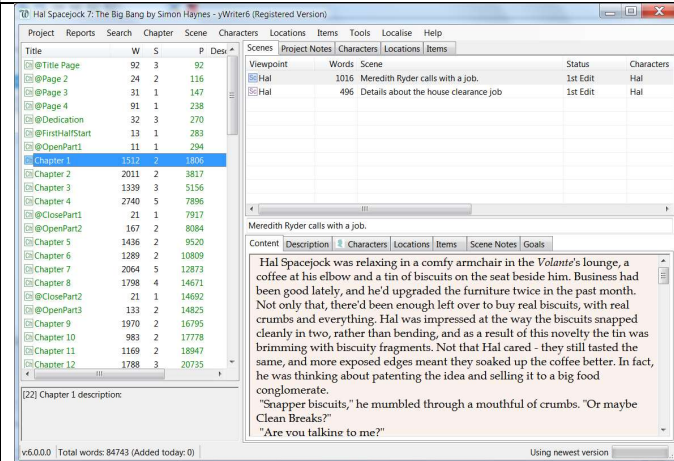
### Why we like it:

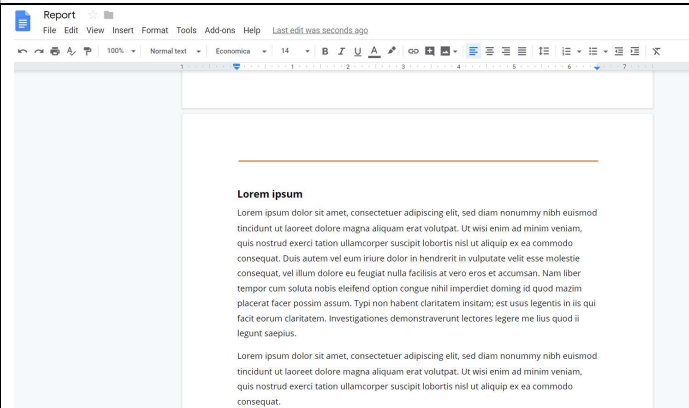
### Why we like it:
